Also I had asked about an honor killing in New York where a husband had beheaded his wife that week for threatening to divorce him. Apparently my questions weren't the ones to be asked!

You may ask if I have a problem with Muslims, I don't! Our church feeds people every Friday at the Friday Food Giveaway which includes people of the Muslim Faith. I love the Muslim people! I do have a great concern with Islam because it isn't always a religion of peace and it also treats it's own members often times in barbaric ways.


You may wonder if there is any alarm here in Sioux Falls? 1. My encounter with Islam at the Library is concern enough for me. Number 2... I question as to why is it that the home converted into a mosque at 701 S. Garfield is allowed to violate the zoning ordinance in Sioux Falls? The

Islamic spokesperson promised at the beginning of acquiring a conditional use permit from the city that there would not be more than 28 people in the small residential house at any one time. Recently a neighbor of the mosque reports that there are 89 people in the tiny structure on a Friday afternoon for the service. I ask, would a church or a temple be able to violate the zoning code? We have seen that new churches have built gigantic parking lots to comply with the City of Sioux Falls Zoning Code. 15.55.020 (6) "Church or temple: One parking space for each four seats in the main auditorium." The city of Sioux Falls in a recent letter to a neighbor of the mosque now says that occupancy cannot be based on zoning codes but rather on building and fire codes which would allow the small structure to have dozens and dozens of people. It comes as no surprise but promises were made that the maximum of 28 people would use the building when the conditional use permit was applied for. (Please see the attached pages). Now it seems that everyone has forgotten what was originally stated, promised and agreed upon resulting in a conditional use permit being given. Number 3...

Another concern is that Avera McKennan is providing space for a Muslim Community Center at 3923 S. Western Ave. in Sioux Falls which is used as a mosque every Friday afternoon at 1 p.m. I have spoken with the officials of the Catholic Church and Avera McKennan, who I believe are being duped. This is another situation, just like the residential neighborhood, where the mosque is located. The hospital believes that it is an innocent, non threatening community center open to the public and have no idea that the community center is becoming a mosque. The former mosque at 1909 E. 6th St. used every Friday for many years is vacant at this time because everyone is down at the Muslim Community Center. Ask your Catholic Friends if they even know about this situation. It may be very interesting!

Lastly, I do encourage you to come to the screening of IRANIUM! Be sure to RSVP as soon as possible! Also I encourage you to pray for the Islamic Community as Christian people reach out to these precious souls with the Love of Jesus!
